- Employed, but need skills to move into a green job
- Currently unemployed
- Someone who has lost their job
- Limited English proficient
- Someone who needs updated energy training
- A criminal ex-offender; including juvenile
- A veteran or qualified spouse of a veteran
- Someone who didn't finish high school
- Someone who meets low-income eligibility guidelines
- Disabled
- A worker impacted by national energy and environmental policy
- A woman
